

GMWSS POSITION DESCRIPTION

Class Title: Sewer Collection Operator I

Department: Operations / Sewer Collection

Supervisor: Sewer Collection Supervisor

Supervises: None

Class Characteristics: Under general supervision, performs semi-skilled and manual labor work activities in the construction, installation, operation, maintenance, cleanliness and/or repair of the sewer collection system; assists other departments/divisions as requested; performs related work as required.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

Essential:

1. Assists with construction, installation, operation, maintenance, cleanliness, and/or repair of sewer collection system.
2. Assists with making sewer taps.
3. Assists in inspecting and locating leaks in lines; repairs leaks as necessary.
4. May operate equipment, vehicles and tools assigned to Division.
5. Pours concrete, blacktop, etc.
6. Assists with keeping all equipment in working order. Performs servicing and assists with preventive maintenance programs on vehicles and equipment; makes minor repairs and/or adjustments to equipment; forwards requests for major repairs to superiors.
7. Cleans vehicles, equipment and tools after use.
8. Assists with other duties in other departments/divisions on a regular basis as requested.

Non-Essential: None.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Training and Experience: Graduation from high school or equivalent supplemented by sufficient work experience to have obtained Class I Sewer Collection License issued by the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Advancement to Sewer Collection Operator I is subject to the recommendation of the Sewer Collection Supervisor and approval of the Operations Manager and General Manager.

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Knowledge:

1. Knowledge of equipment, materials, methods and techniques used in construction, installation, cleanliness, maintenance and repair of sewer collection system.

2. Knowledge of the functions, servicing and maintenance requirements of mechanical equipment and machinery.
3. Knowledge of the geography of the service area.
4. Knowledge of work hazards and applicable safety precautions associated with equipment, tools, vehicles and procedures; and ability to comply with safety regulations and standards.
5. Knowledge of welding, pipe fitting, carpentry, concrete, etc.
6. Knowledge of traffic laws.

Abilities:

1. Ability to operate motorized equipment.
2. Ability to assist with maintenance (including preventive maintenance) on vehicles and equipment.
3. Ability to perform work activities involving carpentry, electrical, plumbing, painting, pouring concrete, etc.
4. Ability to detect mechanical problems and make minor repairs.
5. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with officers, department directors, other employees, and the general public.
6. Physical ability to perform heavy labor for extended periods of time, often under adverse weather conditions.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Instructions: Instructions are initially detailed and specific, but become more general with work experience in the class.

Processes: Work varies slightly and seldom required to take different, new or unusual approaches in completing work assignments.

Review of Work: Most or all of completed work is reviewed.

Analytical Requirements: Duties are of a routine nature.

Physical Demands of the Job: Work requires standing, walking, stooping; must lift objects over 25 pounds; work is performed outdoors regardless of weather conditions; must operate vehicle and equipment; required to be in high places, confined spaces, and using stairs and ladders.

Tools and/or Equipment Used: Vehicles, backhoe, trencher, welder, tapping machine, jack hammer, line locator, air compressor, sewer machines, hand tools, wrenches, weed-eater, chain saw, etc.

Contacts: Frequent public and internal contacts are requirements of the job.

Confidential Information: Little or no use of confidential information.

Mental Effort: Moderate.

Interruptions: Few.

Special Licensing Requirements: Must possess a valid Driver's License; *Must possess, or be willing to obtain, a valid Class B Commercial Driver's License (CDL) issued by the Commonwealth of Kentucky while employed in the class.*

Certification Requirements: Must possess Class I Sewer Collection License issued by the Commonwealth of Kentucky; must obtain Class II, III and IV Sewer Collection License within one year after meeting experience requirements at each level as a condition of continued employment.

Drug and Alcohol Testing Requirements: Must participate in mandatory drug and alcohol testing as a condition of employment and continued employment in this class.

Additional Requirements: Must be able to respond to calls in emergency situations at all hours.

Overtime Provision: Non-exempt.
