<u>Class Title</u>: Sewer Collection Operator Trainee

Department: Operations/Sewer Collection

Supervisor: Sewer Collection Supervisor

Supervises: None

<u>Class Characteristics</u>: Under general supervision, performs semi-skilled and manual labor work activities in construction, installation, operation, maintenance, cleanliness and/or repair of the sewer collection system; assists other departments as requested; performs related work as required.

# General Duties and Responsibilities:

# Essential:

- 1. Assists with construction, installation, operation, maintenance, cleanliness, and/or repair of sewer collection system.
- 2. Assists with making sewer taps.
- 3. Assists in inspecting and locating leaks in lines; repairs leaks as necessary.
- 4. May operate equipment, vehicles, and tools assigned to department after proper licensing and/or training.
- 5. Pours concrete, blacktop, etc.
- Assists with keeping all equipment in working order. Performs servicing and assists with preventative maintenance programs on vehicles and equipment; makes minor repairs and/or adjustments to equipment; forwards requests for major repairs to superiors.
- 7. Cleans vehicles, equipment, and tools after use.
- 8. Assists with other duties in other departments on a regular basis as requested.

### Non-Essential: None.

#### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

<u>Training and Experience</u>: Graduation from high school or equivalent; no work experience requirements for this class.

# Special Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

# Knowledge:

1. Knowledge of, or the ability to learn, equipment, materials, methods, and techniques used in construction, installation, cleanliness, maintenance, and repair of sewer collection system.

- 2. Knowledge of, or the ability to learn, functions, servicing, and maintenance requirements of mechanical equipment and machinery.
- 3. Knowledge of, or the ability to learn, the geography of the service area.
- 4. Knowledge of, or ability to learn, welding, pipe fitting, carpentry, concrete, etc.
- 5. Knowledge of traffic laws.

## Abilities:

- 1. Ability to operate motorized equipment.
- 2. Ability to assist with maintenance (including preventive maintenance) on vehicles and equipment.
- 3. Ability to perform work activities involving carpentry, electrical, plumbing, painting, pouring concrete, etc.
- 4. Ability to detect mechanical problems and make minor repairs.
- 5. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with officers, department supervisors, other employees, and general public.
- 6. Physical ability to perform heavy labor for extended periods of time, often under adverse weather conditions.

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

<u>Instructions</u>: Instructions are initially detailed and specific but become more general with work experience in the class.

<u>Processes</u>: Work varies slightly and seldom required to take a different, new, or unusual approaches in completing work assignments.

Review of Work: Most or all completed work is reviewed.

Analytical Requirements: Duties are of a routine nature.

<u>Physical Demands of the Job</u>: Work requires standing, walking, stooping; must lift objects over 25 pounds; work is performed outdoors regardless of weather conditions; must operate vehicle and equipment; required to be in high places, confined spaces, and using stairs and ladders.

<u>Tools and/or Equipment Used</u>: Vehicles, backhoe, trencher, welder, tapping machine, jack hammer, line locator, air compressor, sewer machines, hand tools, wrenches, weed-eater, chain saw, etc.

Contacts: Frequent public and internal contacts are requirements of the job.

Confidential Information: Little or no use of confidential information.

Mental Effort: Moderate.

Interruptions: Few.

<u>Special Licensing Requirements</u>: Must possess a valid driver's license; must possess, or be willing to obtain, a valid Class B Commercial Driver's License (CDL) issued by the Commonwealth of Kentucky while employed in the class.

<u>Certification Requirements</u>: No certification requirements at this level; however, should obtain Class I, II, III, and IV Sewer Collection License within one year after meeting experience requirements at each level as a condition of continued employment.

<u>Drug and Alcohol Testing Requirements</u>: Must participate in mandatory drug and alcohol testing as a condition of employment and continued employment in this class.

<u>Additional Requirements</u>: Must be able to respond to calls in emergency situations at all hours.

Overtime Provision: Non-exempt.
