Class Title: Resident Inspector III

Supervisor: Engineering Designer

<u>Class Characteristics</u>: Under general administrative direction, reviews plans of new construction; inspects water and sewer line construction performed by outside contractors in ensure compliance with GMWSS specifications; performs related work as required.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

Essential:

- 1. Reviews plans of new water and sewer construction before the project is started; forwards recommendations to supervisor.
- 2. Ensures that projects are not started until final approval from GMWSS and Kentucky Department of Water.
- 3. Responsible for providing information to contractors regarding required licenses, fees, etc.
- Responsible for inspecting new water and sewer line construction performed by outside contractors to ensure compliance with GMWSS specifications.
- Responsible for ensuring that contractors install appropriate valves, fittings, etc.
- 6. Performs hydrant maintenance.
- 7. Assists Wastewater Treatment Plants and Wastewater Collection Department when time allows or in case of emergencies.
- 8. Utilizes chemicals for bacteria control in water pipes, builds manifolds and pours cement according to prescribed standards.
- 9. Responsible for inspecting subdivision developments.
- 10. Maintains vehicles, tools, and equipment, including preventative maintenance.
- 11. Performs related duties as required.

Non-Essential: None.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

<u>Training and Experience</u>: Graduation from high school or equivalent supplemented by five years work experience; Associates degree in Civil Engineering may be substituted for two years work experience.

Special knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

Knowledge:

- Extensive knowledge of equipment, materials, methods, and practices used in pipeline construction and maintenance, including tapping, bricklaying, caulking, and related activities.
- 2. Extensive knowledge of the layout of water and sewer lines, including the locations of valves and appurtenances.
- Extensive knowledge of federal, state, and local laws and administrative regulations regarding water and sewer line construction, maintenance, and cleanliness.
- 4. Extensive knowledge of GMWSS policies and procedures, including safety practices.
- 5. Extensive knowledge of and ability to ensure compliance with safety requirements.
- 6. Extensive knowledge of computers and applicable software programs.

Skills:

1. Skill in reading construction plans and detailed specifications.

Abilities:

- 1. Ability to perform physical activities in all weather conditions, rough terrain, heavy vegetation, etc.
- 2. Ability to read and interpret blueprints, plans, and/or specifications and to make recommendations based on the readings.
- 3. Ability to operate vehicles, tools, and equipment associated with construction, maintenance, and cleanliness of water and sewer lines.
- 4. Ability to install and/or repair water valves and hydrants, and sewer line appurtenances.
- 5. Ability to ensure that standard and updated safety regulations and standards are always adhered to.
- 6. Ability to operate computer and applicable software programs.
- 7. Ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing.
- 8. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationship with consulting engineers, GMWSS employees, and the general public.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

<u>Instructions</u>: Instructions are somewhat general; many aspects of the work are covered specifically but must use some of own judgement.

<u>Processes</u>: Must occasionally consider different course of action, or deviate from standard operating procedures, to get the job done.

Review of Work: Most or all of completed work is reviewed.

<u>Analytical Requirements</u>: Assignments frequently involve decisions based on a wide knowledge of many factors where application of advanced or technical concepts is required.

<u>Physical Demands of the Job</u>: Work is performed outdoors regardless of weather conditions. Must lift objects weighing more than 25 pounds; must be outdoors and exposed to weather, rough and hilly terrain, heavy vegetation, mud, water, noise, etc.; must be in high places, confined spaces, and use stairs and ladders; must operate vehicle as a requirement of the job.

<u>Tools and/or Equipment Used</u>: Vehicle, calculator, tripod and level, tapping machine, test kits, valves, wrenches, shovels, etc.

<u>Contacts</u>: Frequent public and internal contacts requiring tact and diplomacy are requirements of the job.

Confidential Information: Little or no use of confidential information.

Mental Effort: Moderate.

Interruptions: Frequent.

Special Licensing Requirements: Must possess and maintain a valid driver's license.

<u>Drug and Alcohol Testing Requirements</u>: Must participate in mandatory drug and alcohol testing as a condition of employment and continued employment.

<u>Certification/Registration Requirements</u>: Must possess either Class III Distribution License or Class III Wastewater Plant Operators license while employed in the class.

Overtime Provision: Non-exempt.
